<u>From now on, The People's Computer is encrypted and safeguarded with the following:</u>

File Vault:

- Mac encryption of all files stored on this computer

Internet Firewall:

- Prevents all incoming data except through port 123
- UDP traffic blocked
- Stealth mode on

Firefox Browser:

- No private data including passwords, forms, etc. are stored
- No cache, cookies, or history are stored

Therefore you can use the internet without fear of people snooping on your business, like the feds.
